Re: Testimony in Support of SB 566 – Direct Wine Shipper’s License

Dear Chairman Carter Conway and Members of the Committee:

The Maryland League of Conservation Voters would like to voice its support for SB 566 – Direct Wine Shipper’s License. We believe this legislation supports sustainable farming practices and will protect and preserve Maryland’s open space.

For many Maryland farmers, 2010 will be last year they will receive subsidies from the Maryland Tobacco Buyout. As a result, many farmers will be left with some difficult choices regarding their land. Without economic incentives these farm lands will eventually be sold and open space will be lost.

Passage of SB 566 would establish such an incentive with the creation of a Direct Wine Shipper’s License to strengthen Maryland’s existing wine industry and encourage its growth, thereby making grape growing a viable alternative for Tobacco Buyout farmers. Passage of this bill will also provide smaller vintners, whose wines are not carried through existing distribution channels, the ability to sell their product to a broader base supporting the sale of a growing agricultural product – Maryland wine.

We wish to thank Senator Raskin for his leadership on this issue and the committee for its consideration of this important matter. We respectfully urge a favorable report of SB 566.
