IMPORTANT BILLS TO WATCH

A few of the environmental community’s top bills have been filed. They are:



HB 369: Chesapeake Bay 2010 Trust Fund and Nonpoint Source Fund

The Chesapeake Bay 2010 Trust Fund will allow Maryland to significantly increase its ability to meet the goals outlined in the Chesapeake 2000 Agreement.



HB 374: EmPOWER Maryland Energy Efficiency Act of 2008 & HB 368: Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative - Maryland Strategic Energy Investment Program

HB 374 requires Maryland to reduce its per capita energy use 15 percent by 2015. HB 368 ensures Maryland Energy Administration funding through the auction of carbon credits for full implementation of HB 374.



Bills addressing the other priorities, **Critical Area reform** and **Global Warming Solutions**, are expected to drop soon.
