COMMITTEE ACTION

SB 309: Global Warming Solutions - Reductions in Greenhouse Gases

Education Health & Environmental Affairs Committee – **HEARING ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 19**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ Global warming is the greatest environmental challenge of our time
- ◆ Everything we do to address global warming will have immediate benefits to the state – creating jobs, lowering costs to consumers and businesses through energy efficiency upgrades, and making our power system more reliable by diversifying our energy sources



SB 417: Public Service Commission - Energy Efficiency and Conservation Programs and Services - Prohibition of Surcharge Without Customer Consent

Finance Committee – **HEARING ON WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 20**

POSITION: *OPPOSE*

- ◆ Energy efficiency is critical to reducing greenhouse gas emissions
- ◆ The opt-in programs outlined in this bill will not help Maryland reach the goal set of a 15% reduction by 2015

SB 205: EmPOWER Maryland Energy Efficiency Act of 2008 &

SB 268: Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative - Maryland Strategic Energy Investment Program

Finance Committee – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ SB 205 requires Maryland to reduce its per capita energy use 15 percent by 2015
- ◆ SB 268 ensures Maryland Energy Administration funding through the auction of carbon credits for full implementation of SB 205
- ◆ On average, consumers save two to three dollars for every dollar invested in energy efficiency



SB 213: Chesapeake Bay 2010 Trust Fund and Nonpoint Source Fund

Education Health and Environmental Affairs – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ The Chesapeake Bay 2010 Trust Fund will allow Maryland to significantly increase its ability to meet the goals outlined in the Chesapeake 2000 Agreement

SB 209: Renewable Portfolio Standard Percentage Requirements - Acceleration

Finance Committee – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ Maryland should put itself ahead of the curve on creating clean energy industries
- ◆ This will make our electricity system more reliable through diversifying our energy sources, promote economic development, and clean up the environment

SB 204: Maryland Transit Administration - Transit-Oriented Development

Finance Committee – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) is a critical part of the solution to curb global warming
- ◆ TOD makes best use of transit investment, creates places where more daily trips can be done without driving, more efficiently uses land resources, and is a cornerstone for Maryland's smart growth efforts

SB 207: Solar and Geothermal Tax Incentive and Grant Program

Budget & Taxation and Finance Committees – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ This program has been successful in urging consumers to install small-scale solar and geothermal projects at home
- ◆ Raising the caps on these grants will make it easier for more homeowners to take advantage of this program
- ◆ Increasing our use of clean, renewable energy like solar and geothermal is necessary to curbing global warming

SB 208: High Performance Buildings Act

Budget & Taxation Committee – **ALREADY HEARD**

POSITION: *SUPPORT*

- ◆ High performance buildings are designed to efficiently use natural resources for minimal environmental impact and economic cost and allow for significant reductions in energy and water use
- ◆ Having our state government lead by example would go a long way to making green buildings be the norm and not the exception
